
Guiding Principles

- Developed to Guide BMMI Working Group Decisions
- Stay true to project purpose

Guiding Principles

- 1. Provide affordable, open-access, middle-mile broadband infrastructure to enable last-mile network connectivity throughout the state.
- 2. Build the network expeditiously, leveraging existing infrastructure, networks, and construction projects, where feasible.
- 3. Prioritize connectivity to unserved and underserved communities, including community institutions.

Statewide Middle Mile Network Initial Staff Proposal

- 8,000 road miles
- All state highways / rights of way
- Connecting census designated places with households unserved by fixed internet service <100 Mbps households
- These unserved communities are represented by the yellow dots—the size of which varies with the number of unserved households in each Census Designated Place.

Middle Mile Locations Determination Process

- CPUC must solicit and receive public comments within 90 days (before October 21, 2021). Government Code Section 11549.54(f)
 - Criteria for identifying locations. Government Code Section 11549.54(b)
 - Prioritization. Government Code Section 11549.54(c)-(e)
- CPUC, in collaboration with the third-party administrator, provides middle mile network locations in a report to CDT. Government Code Section 11549.54(a)
 - Locations shall be updated "from time to time". Government Code Section 11549.54(a)
- CDT plans and develops the middle mile network using the above information. Government Code Section 11549.54(h).
