GA4 Analytics Contract

- If you're managing your own analytics contract, you will need a new contract due to a new pricing formula with GA4.
- We are available to manage your account.
 - Existing accounts/properties can be transferred under our analytics organization.

GA4 JavaScript Code Snippet (1 of 3)

- We've updated our GA4 code snippet to address security guidance:
 - Secure flag
 - SameSite attribute
 - Cookie domain
- The update restricts the GA4 measurement ID to its specific domain
 - GA4 ID won't travel across ca.gov sites

GA4 JavaScript Code Snippet (2 of 3)

Original code

• gtag('config', 'G-XXXXXXXXXX'); // statewide GA4 measurement ID

Updated code

 gtag('config', 'G-XXXXXXXXXX', {cookie_flags:'secure;samesite=lax;domain='}); // statewide GA4 measurement ID

Custom Reports

 - 1. File downloads
 - 2. Site Search Terms

Full list: Template updates

Optimized color files (1 of 2)

Optimized large color CSS files. They're more than 100 times smaller.



What this means

- Color theme file super small (only 1K)
- Adding color theme CSS file is now optional

Optimized color files (2 of 2)

CSS color variables

Converted all SASS color variables into CSS color variables

BEFORE: color: \$color-p1; NOW: color: var(--color-p1, #fdb81e)

New: Moved all color related styles from separate color theme

CSS file into core CSS file

New: Oceanside theme is default


Customizable color theme. Change color variables:

- Three primary colors
- Three secondary colors



How it can help departments


- 1. Jump starts development







What is this UI kit?

- Uses Figma (software)
- Contains
 - State template components, patterns, and styles
 - Starter site page templates
- Uses
 - Usually for writers, designers, comms
 - Create digital webpage mock-ups
 - Add and edit content (text, images, etc)
 - Hand over the design to developer to code

UI Kit Tour and Demo

California State Web Template UI Kit

Use this UI Kit to prototype your department website or projects. It provides a library of elements that are ready to go when you need them. You save time because you don't have to build or scour the internet for items. This helps you:

- · Quickly and easily retrieve existing components, typography, and colors for your project
- Review and receive approval for a design/concept
- · Communicate expectations with your developer
- · QA/validate after something is developed

We also provide a starter site. It provides all the basic items a department usually needs to create a website. Page templates include:

- Homepage
- Contact us and About us
- 2 landing page templates
- Careers

How it can help you

- Saves time (create a mock-up without coding)
- Use for reviews and approval for a design/concept
- Communicate expectations with project team/developer
- QA/validate after something is developed
- Can send to vendor to align with CA web standards

Sample UX workflow using Figma

- 1. Research and finalize content
- 2. Use the **UI kit to mock-up design**
- 3. Show design to developers for feasibility
- 4. Show design to project team for review and approval
- 5. Make edits to the design
- 6. Send approved **design** to developer
- 7. Developer codes the design
- 8. QA against the **design** and go-live


