

State Data Center Services

- CDT is a full IT service provider, offering services to state and local government entities in all 58 California counties, through two data centers. Services include:
 - Infrastructure (Cloud and on-premise platform hosting, co-location, website hosting, etc.)
 - Network & Telecommunications (CGEN, CALNET contracts, etc.)
 - Platform Hosting (OS, database, storage, middleware and application software support)
 - Tenant Managed Services (computer room space and utilities)
 - Professional Services (technology consulting)



State Data Center Services

- Services are provided by CDT staff, vendors, or public-private partnerships.
- Each customer is assigned an Account Lead—their single point of contact for IT services, who acts as the liaison between our customers and the service areas. Find your Account Lead at <u>https://cdt.ca.gov/account-lead-lookup/</u>

Statewide Digital Services

- Team of ~80 software engineers, product managers, web developers, UX specialists, data and geospatial specialists, and other technologists
- Office of Digital Services (formerly the Office of Enterprise Technology) is an outcome-oriented, cross-functional team of developers, engineers, product managers, project managers, data scientists, geospatial experts, human-centered design SMEs, technical specialists, and more that are dedicated to scoping, developing, launching, and implementing human-centered technology solutions for California's most pressing technical needs in partnership with other state agencies.

Statewide Digital Services (continued)

- We are responsible for both the <u>CAWeb offering</u> and <u>statewide analytics</u>, as well as manage all <u>*.ca.gov domain requests</u>.

- We are building a statewide Digital Identity pilot to give residents the ability to have one login for any state service.

Statewide Information Security (continued)

The California Cybersecurity Integration Center (Cal-CSIC) serves as the central organizing hub of state government's cybersecurity activities. The Cal-CSIC provides warnings of cyberattacks to government agencies and nongovernmental partners, coordinates information sharing among these entities, assesses risks to critical infrastructure and information technology networks, prioritizes cyber threats and support public and private sector partners.

Department of Rehabilitation

- Provides services and advocacy resulting in employment, independent living, and equality for persons with disabilities.
- Administers one of the largest vocational rehabilitation and independent living program in the country.
- Believes in the talent and potential of individuals with disabilities.



Disability Statistics

- 25% of adults in the United States identify as having some type of disability.
- 23% of adults in California identify as having some type of disability.
- 51% of US adults prefer to access government services online.
- One in 4 Californians will be 60 or over by 2030. Disability can occur at any point in life and is more common for older individuals.



Accessibility

- Technology design and implementation that makes electronic information usable by people with disabilities.
- Everyone has access to information and services.
- Everyone can fully participate.
- No extra effort is required.
- Value for everyone is comparable.
- Examples: Screen readers for blind users. Captions for deaf and hard-of-hearing users.

State Technology Policy

Under the <u>California Legislative process</u>, the Assembly & Senate Bills (AB/SB) are proposed, passed, signed, and become law in the form of California Government Code (GC). GC impacting statewide IT is analyzed and developed into policy to comply with the law of the bill.

Government Code can be found under the <u>California Legislative Information</u>. State IT Authority for Agency/Chief Information Officers is GC 11545 and 11546.

IT GC that have been chaptered can be found under the following:

- General IT Government Code Sections 11545 11548
- Office of Technology Services 11534 11543
- Office of Security and Privacy 11549 11549.8



State Technology Policy State Administrative Manual (SAM)

The Department of General Services (DGS) maintains the State Administrative Manual (SAM) for all California services.

SAM is a reference resource for statewide policies, procedures, requirements and information developed and issued by authoring agencies which include the Governor's Office, Department of Finance (DOF), Department of Human Resources (CalHR), Department of General Services (DGS), and the California Department of Technology (CDT).

State Technology Policy State Information Management Manual (SIMM)

The California Department of Technology (CDT) maintains the State Information Management Manual (<u>SIMM</u>) for all IT policy. This contains the standards, instructions, forms, and templates that State agencies must use to comply with IT policy.

- <u>SIMM 05a lists all the IT polices that have statutory due dates.</u>
- New policies or changes are communicated in the form of
 - Technology Letters (TL)
 - Standards and Procedures (PS)
- Notification emails are sent when new TL or PS are released

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The <u>Statewide Technology Procurement</u> (STP) conducts and oversees statewide Information Technology (IT) procurement related to IT projects.

- Conduct competitive procurement for IT Projects (RFP, Challenge Based Procurement)
- Negotiate complex and critical IT contracts
- Review and approve Non-Competitive Bid (NCB) Justifications

Training on How to Move from the Business Side to an IT Classification

 CDT offers a variety of training for staff and leaders already in an IT classification, but we also need to focus on entry level IT

Mapping IT Classifications & Functional Titles

- To promote consistency across the state and make it easier for the private sector to search for state IT jobs, WDAC created a universal list of six IT domains, broken down by Subject, Description, Functional Titles, and IT Classifications
- Hiring Process Improvement Pilot
- Improve the hiring timeline for IT positions; average is 87 days • Hiring Above Minimum (HAM) Policy Change; took effect 10/1/24
