+ • Americans with Disabilities Act Updates

- New requirements for **all web content** – including pages with GIS applications and data – to a specific standard, the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines, Version 2.1 Level AA.
 - Often abbreviated as WCAG 2.1 AA.
 - While the name says “Guidelines”, **federal law makes them a requirement**
- Your government, school district, or university almost certainly needs to comply by April 24 2026, with limited exceptions for very small municipalities and districts.
 - You must also ensure contractors and vendors who produce public facing web content comply.

Accessibility and GIS

- It's complicated!
- Some core principles to start with, but these **may not satisfy your legal requirements fully**.
 - Meet WCAG requirements for the application itself, related to keyboard navigation, screenreader compatibility, etc.
 - Provide alt text of the application content and a description of key takeaways or interpretations of data in the viewer, if applicable
 - Provide a prominent means for viewing the source data in an accessible form and downloading the data as an alternative access mechanisms.
- But there's also quite a bit more in WCAG 2.1!
 - Esri products don't always fully comply
